A Short History Of The Randle Trophy International Women's Team Match And The Participation of the United States

During the Smallbore Prone Phase of the National Rifle and Pistol Championships a sharp-eyed behavioral scientist, sitting in the assembly area at Camp Perry, might notice some unusual behavior. Before the start of the last match on the second day of the metallic sight aggregate it might be noted that an unusually large number of the usually safety conscious women shooters will have removed their ear plugs or doffed headsets. With an air of feigned casualness many women will be drifting toward the public address system speakers. While attempting to look disinterested, in fact, these women are intently listening for the first hiss and crackle of the speakers that will herald the announcement of the preliminary cut off score and probable team make up of the world's most prestigious women's postal rifle event: The Randle Trophy International Women's Match.

In The Beginning...

A *British women's civil service* rifle club based in London in one of those little historical ironies, instigated the match, which is sponsored by the National Rifle Association of America. In 1950 the NRA received a letter from the club's secretary, Muriel Bryant. The British ladies were throwing down the gauntlet to any American club, made up of female civil servants, to compete in a prone postal match. When the challenge lay unanswered for some time the NRA secretary, Frank Daniel, forwarded the request to Eleanor Dunn.

There being no women's club in the US composed entirely of women civil servants Miss Dunn, a prominent member of the shooting community, arranged for the American Women's Club Rifle Team to compete as the American representative.

The rules for this match required the teams to fire from the prone position with metallic sights at an appropriate distance and target. The team had to be made up exclusively of women and was required to fire the *match at the team's home club and complete the match within 24 hours*. Each team was limited to one coach who would act as scorer and forward the scores to Dunn who prepared the results bulletin. When all of the shooting, coaching, scoring and mailing had been completed the team from Great Britain won by 45 points.

The event proved popular enough that Dunn felt compelled to organize what she would come to call, unofficially, 'The Second International Postal Match for English Speaking Women'. To raise the level of competition she expanded the list of the competitors invited to participate in the 1951 match. Dunn invited teams from the national shooting associations of Canada, Ireland, Australia, New Zealand, and South Africa while Bryant organized entries from England, Scotland, and Wales.

Thirty-two teams from England, Scotland, Wales, Canada, and the United States competed in the 1951 tournament. In the United States, Connecticut, Massachusetts, New York, and Washington each entered two teams. The huge leap in participation caused the original deadline for submitting scores to be moved from April 30 to June 30. The extensive amount of paperwork generated by the match came close to overwhelming the indefatigable Dunn but relief, and a major change in the match, was in the offing.

During the latter part of 1951 the NRA had been receiving a great deal of positive correspondence concerning the match. NRA President General Merritt Edson took notice of the reaction to Dunn's efforts and thought that bringing it under the organization's competitive umbrella would provide both more efficient administrative support and give the match greater legitimacy. Dunn has hoped that the NRA would take just such a move and she readily gave her consent.

The NRA's Executive Committee minutes of the 22nd of March 1952 report that, "General Edson outlined to the Committee the action taken by the Headquarters staff to establish a Women's International Team Match similar to the present Dewar Trophy International Team Match. He further stated that Mr. Thurman Randle, Past-President of the Association and present member of the Executive Council had offered to donate a trophy to this match which in due course would be known as the Randle Trophy International Women's Team Match. He explained that regulations would be issued by the NRA and that the targets would be

scored by the NRA." And so The Randle Trophy International Women's Rifle Team Match was born.

Randle Rules...

The Randle Match is conducted under the competition rules of the National Rifle Association of America with registered targets supplied by the sponsor. The course of fire has always been the Dewar Course, with metallic sights. Each shooter fires 20 shots for record at 50 yards on the A-23/5 target and additional 20 shots at 100 yards on the A-25 target. Specific Randle Trophy rules require that all members of the team be women. Each shooter is entitled to an individual coach who must also be female. The team is selected, and fires, during the course of the competing nations' national championship. For Americans that means that the venue is Camp Perry and for Great Britain the famous ranges at Bisley.

The Early Days...

The United States's maiden foray into the Randle Trophy competition came at Jacksonville, Florida at the 1952 National Smallbore Prone Rifle Championships. Dunn was invited to captain the first US Randle team. Circumstances prevented her from attending the match and she regrettably had to decline the honor. Stepping into her shoes was another well-known shooter with the same first name, Elinor Bell. Bell, along with her coach, and fellow firing member, Betty Ingleright became the first officials of a US Randle Team. The other eight shooters were Margaret Davis, Ruth Morgan, Olga Patterson, Gwen

Rossman, Neva Seagly, Judy Thompson, Helen Gaston, and Emilie Wenner. Vera Renftl, whose husband Jack was the coach of the Dewar Team that year, served as alternate. The official witness was the Lincolnesque Captain Arthur Jackson of the US Air Force. Jackson, a medallist on Pan American and Olympic Teams, would be the first of only a few men ever to serve in an official capacity with the Randle Team.

1953 would be a year of Randle landmarks. After being adrift for a while The Nationals would return to Camp Perry bringing with it the Randle Match. Eleanor Dunn would make her only appearance as a member of the Randle Team serving as team captain. The team from Great Britain was captained by Muriel Bryant making this the only match where the founders of the match series would appear together on the official results.

The 1953 contest also was the first appearance of teams from Canada and Australia. In 1955 teams from both South Rhodesia/Zimbabwe and South Africa made their maiden appearances while New Zealand would wait until 1958 to make its first entry.

Canadian women were the first to post possibles when, in the second Randle in 1953, Mrs. G.G. Coleman and Mrs. W.S. MacNab each notched 400s. It would take until 1955 to the the United States match that milestone. Mrs. James Greer, Jr., and Mrs. Pat Burkhalter would shoot clean targets to give them that historical first for the sponsors.

Buried in the middle of the scores for the US Team in 1953 was the first mention of the Driver Dynasty. Shooting a 397 Marianne Jensen would reappear in 1954, after a

wedding, as Marianne Driver. During the next forty years the name of either Driver or one of her daughters, Marianne Vitito and Lenore Lemanski, would appear on all but three Randle Team bulletins. In 1960, 82, and, 85 all three would make the team for a Driver Family hat trick and in 1986 the triumvirate would reach its zenith with Driver serving as team captain, Lemanski as coach and Vitito a shooter.

Randle records indicate another *unusual 'record' in the shooting family* area. It seems that the husbands of Randle Team Captains Mary Cook, Sue Mitchell, and Ellen Ross: Art Cook, Bob Mitchell, and Dave Ross have served as Dewar Team captains.

“The Randle That Almost Wasn’t”...

Randle Team selection rules had not yet been formalized after the Nationals returned to Camp Perry and *this lead, in 1954, to “The Randle That Almost Wasn’t”*. In 1954 shooters who wished to fire in matches considered for the National Championship at Camp Perry were required to qualify in regional competitions. Although shooting at Camp Perry did not require regional qualification the participation in certain matches, such as the Randle, did require the shooter to have earned a qualifying berth. This little known rule caused some highly qualified woman to become ineligible to shoot the match. In fact, the team captain and coach; Viola Pollum and Driver, had not fired in a regional themselves. The 1954 team had a close call. With only 10 eligible shooters and no alternates qualified to shoot the second Randle.

the offending rule was quickly stricken to avoid future problems.

The United States emerged early as the dominant team in Randle competition. Participating countries have included The United States, Great Britain, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, and Rhodesia/Zimbabwe. However, the only teams ever to win have been the US, Great Britain, and South Africa. The US went undefeated from 1952 through 1964. Starting in the mid 80s a growing seriousness of purpose by the British women and the fact that the Olympic Festival, generally scheduled around the time of Perry, always draws off a few of the US women shooters has turned the match into much more of a horse race. Britain mounted a serious challenge to US domination in 1985 by winning seven of the next ten matches, including a string of four straight victories beginning in 1990. The era of US complacency has ended and each shooter and coach is working hard to wring out every last X.

Early US Success...

The early US success can probably be traced to several factors. During the 1950s and early 1960s the *US was the source of the world's best* smallbore equipment and ammunition. A Winchester 52 or a Remington 37, right out of the box or customized, was far superior to the Parker Hale and BSA rifles available to the competition. Ammunition such as EZXS, Mark III, or Remington Rifle Match could be purchased in large lots after it had been mated to the rifle. If you were a hard holder the work might be done for you at the factory in the manufacturer's 100-yard indoor test tunnels. In those days the American munitions

manufacturers were a highly visible presence at Camp Perry with each occupying a building on Commercial Row.

Secondly, American women are serious shooters who take themselves, and are taken, seriously by all competitors. They are not there to win high woman awards, they are there to win. The third reason, and possibly most important, is the range. Simply put, by those who have been there, a windy day at Perry is better than a calm day at Bisley. The advent of Eley ammunition and the availability of better rifles have helped the British ladies to narrow the gap.

The other nations competing did not fare as well as the two major powers. Various reasons put forth for the failure of the other teams to come to the fore are the relative smaller number of woman shooters in those nations and the greater difficulty in obtaining first class equipment. The fact that the target is only shot in the United States, and the lack of familiarity with it, is a disadvantage that must also be taken into account.

In the early 1950s individual wind gauges were not yet allowed so the American strategy was pretty simple. They would just "get there first-est with the most-est" *and shoot in the calmest conditions of the day.* The women would gather in the predawn darkness, around 5:30 AM, down a light breakfast of pastry and coffee and get setup.

As soon as the gathering daylight was strong enough for them to see 50 yards they would start shooting. By the time the short-range stage was complete the sun would be high

enough so that the 100-yard targets were now easily visible. By 8:30 AM the match was over and the targets were off to the scorer.

With a changed Camp Perry match schedule the Randle is now shot on the same day as the Dewar Match. The Dewar Team has first choice of match time and this leaves the women shooting in the mid-morning when the wind and mirage are picking up. In the last ten years or so the Randle Team has fired the 100-yard stage first. This tactic, picked up from the British, saves the time and effort of returning the target frames to the 50-yard line at the end of the Dewar. This allows the long-range stage of the match to be fired before the conditions break down too much. Never the less the value of a good coach can not be understated in light of the later shooting time.

The years have seen continuous improvements in the shooting skills of American women. As a result, one of the few things to change since the start of the match is that The Randle Team has become tougher to make now than a few decades ago. And, while little has changed in the conduct of the match, some of the closeness felt on earlier teams has sadly disappeared.

It is not uncommon to see a great many women on the Dewar Team. The preoccupation with this match, fired first, draws them away from Randle prematch activities. An increasingly more hectic Perry schedule has taken its toll on the formal conduct of the team meeting surrounding the final selection of the team. On the other hand the introduction of the computer has relieved the team officials of having to handle the tedious task of keep track of every woman shooter by hand. The

record keeping required a great deal of legwork and bookkeeping which was distracting, to say the least, while trying to compete.

Changes...

The Randle result bulletins are an indicator of changes in shooting and social attitudes. For example, by the early 1960s the team had become increasingly more youthful and this would be no where more apparent than in the use of titles before the shooter's names. Since the first Randle bulletin each shooter's name was proceeded by the title indicating marital status. It was a little touch that reflected the formal and dignified attitude of a courtlier era. In 1952 all but 2 of the 13 shooters were listed, as "Mrs." while in 1963, the last year the titles appeared, *9 of the 14 were "Miss"*. The 'youth movement' was never more apparent when, in 1967, only two team members were older than 26-year-old team captain Lenore Lemanski. As if to emphasize the point the NRA began to supplement the pre-match continental breakfast with juice and milk reflecting the palates and dietary habits of the younger shooters.

The 1960s...

Three major Randle benchmarks would be recorded in the 1960s. The big news was Janet Friddell. Friddell became the first American woman to shoot on a Pershing Team in 1961. She was also the Pershing Match high shooter with a 27X possible. She then joined the Randle ladies and shot another clean with 29Xs to top the field in that match. After refilling her loading block she joined with fellow members of the Dewar team to fire that postal. In this match, on the tougher English

target, she was again at the top of her form, but two points off of the leader's score. Friddell's skill, and the happy timing of the three matches at the same time, lead her to complete a hat trick that would not be matched until 1997 when Eliza Bishop would repeat Friddell's tour de force.

Secondly, the British broke the US strangle hold on the match when they notched their first victory in 1965. By a two-point margin, 3982 to 3980, they edged out the US to lead the field of six teams. The historic win by Great Britain came on the heels of the 1964 match where they were displaced from their familiar second place finish by New Zealand, the first time the top two places were not occupied by the United States and Great Britain, in that order. The history making British team was led by Captain Lilian M. Geer and Coach Nina Lamberg, with Daphne Cullimore, Margaret Gibbs, Betty Foster, Susan Russell, Janet Jordon, Marion Payne, Pat Morgan, Mary Farnell, Janice Locke, Janet Mason shooting with Sheila Watt, and Gay Fraser serving as alternates.

Finally, the curtain would ring down on an era when Ruth Morgan passed the torch to a new generation of Randle women in 1968. As the 1968 team captain she made the final Randle appearance by a member of the pioneering 1952 team. The 1960s closed with four consecutive US wins but the second twenty years of the Randle would be far different from the first two decades.

The 1970s...

The decade of the 1970s would open with a British victory in the first

match and they would win another in 1978. The British victories would be noted but would barely check the US juggernaut as the American women continued to roll up a series of impressive victories that would culminate on August 12, 1975.

Building on the foundation of a winning tradition, and the experience of the older shooters, a crop of youngsters would carry the US Randle Team to a dizzying height on that bright Tuesday morning. Under the watchful eye of the official witness, veteran British Randle Team member Veronica Tidmarsh, the ten women of the US Randle Team took up position and proceeded to shoot 400 record shots inside the ten ring for a perfect 4000X4000! The X count of 303 was, oddly enough, the same as the caliber of Britain's standard military bolt rifle: the Short Magazine Lee Enfield. Under the guidance of Captain Winnifred Carr and Coach Ellen Ross, the team of Sharon Ehrhardt, Schuyler Helbing, Mary Stidworthy, Sherri Lewellen, Janet Spohn, Diana Zimmerman, Barbara Hampson, Deborah Hicks, Karen Monez, Sue Floer, and alternates Inez Sargent and Chandler Chapman had accomplished a seemingly impossible feat.

In 1973 the only recorded instance of an alternate firing occurred. Marianne Driver stood aside and coached first alternate Nancy Lausten. *Driver's friendship with the Lausten family stretched back to the 1930s when she first met the Lausten girls father, Bob, who was a junior shooter. Driver coached Lausten, in her only Randle appearance, to a 399-33X as the United States rolled to a 3995 win.*

As Close As It Gets...

The competition in the Randle is always tough. The tightest match on record was fired in 1987 when the United States and Great Britain tied with scores of 3993 each! The scorers had to go to Xs to determine the winner. With 800 shots fired, and only 14 of them out side of the ten ring it came down to a six X difference. Less than one X per shooter gave the United States the win in the closest contested Randle.

South Africa Triumphs...

In a reflection of global politics the International Olympic Committee forbade member nations from participating in international sporting events with South Africa or face sanctions. Under this restriction South Africa was unable to participate for several years. However, in 1997, the South African women won the Randle with a score of 3985-238X. In much the same way that marked the Australian victory in the 1972 Dewar Match it is the only time that Great Britain or the United States has been shut out of the top spot. A somewhat surprised United States team ended up in third place.

US Randle Team Alumna: Pollum, Stidworthy and Millard- Sparks

Randle Team alumnae have distinguished themselves in a wide variety of shooting areas. Viola Pollum became the first woman to win the National Prone Championship when she topped the field at Camp Perry in 1955. Mary Stidworthy would be the next winning two consecutive titles in 1977 and 1978 and a third in 1981. She is only one of four people to win back-to-back victories in the history of

the tournament. In 1993 Carolyn Millard-Sparks would outshoot all comers for the prone title.

Karen Monez...

The elfin Karen Monez would set a furious pace in position competition. Starting in 1976 she would win the C. B. Lister Trophy, emblematic of the National Indoor Four Position Championship, five times, shooting three perfect 800s in the process. The John Wallace Gillies trophy for winning the National Indoor NRA Three Position Championship would be hers three times with back-to-back wins in 1989 and 1990. She would round out this string by being the first woman to win the National Outdoor Position Championship in 1987. Monez also earned membership on many championship teams on both the national and international level.

Godlove and Parmentier ...

Mary Godlove is the only woman to win the Butterman Trophy; given to the top shooter in the NRA's National Indoor International Three Position Championship. Gloria Parmentier, two times winner of the Lister Trophy and a Gillies Trophy winner, was a team mate of Monez and Godlove at the U.S. *Army's Marksmanship Unit*. They earned numerous national titles in smallbore position shooting while representing the United States in various international competitions.

Wanda Jewell...

Wanda Jewell began her international shooting career in 1973. A contemporary member of the U.S. *Army's Marksmanship Unit with Monez, Godlove, and Parmentier* Jewell was also a member of the 1984 and 1988 Olympic Teams. She earned a bronze medal in the three position event at the '84 games. *Jewell became the first woman to head a major national shooting team, in the traditionally male dominated sport, when she was appointed as the rifle coach of the United States Shooting Team in June of 2000. Two years later, in April of 2002, she became the Director of Operations for USA Shooting.*

Murdock and Spurgin...

Margaret Murdock would make Olympic history in 1976 when she became the first, and only, woman to win an Olympic medal in open rifle shooting competition. In a tight three-position match she battled fellow American Lanny Bassham to a photo finish for the gold. In the end Murdock was awarded the silver on the basis of a tie-breaking rule. At the award ceremony, during the playing of the national anthem, Bassham, gallantly pulled Murdock onto the top step with him to tell the world that her accomplishment was equal to his. By 1984 the International Olympic Committee had established women only competition that paralleled the men's events. This action would insure Murdock's place in sports history while setting the stage for another Randle woman to join her. In the opening event of the 1984 Los Angeles Olympic Games Pat Spurgin won the Gold Medal in the Women's Air Rifle match.

This win made her the first victor in any of the new ladies events.

Nancy Tompkins-Gallagher...

Nancy Tompkins-Gallagher first made her name as a high power shooter before beginning an equal serious application of her skills to smallbore prone. Tompkins-Gallagher has been a shooting member of several Palma Trophy teams. Her skill in long range earned her the Leech Cup, the trophy awarded to the winner of the *NRA's premier iron sight 1,000 yard match*, in 1997, the same year her 17 year old daughter Michelle won the anysight equivalent of the Leech, the Wimbledon Cup. In 1998 Tompkins-Gallagher became the first woman to *win the NRA's National High Power Rifle Championship*. Linda Smallbone *is Great Britain's answer to Tompkins-Gallagher* as she has represented her country on many Randle Teams as well as in the Palma Trophy Match.

Nancy Napolski Johnson...

Nancy Napolski Johnson was a member of the 1994 Randle Team. As a collegiate shooter she earned All American honors in 1994, 1995, and 1996 with the air rifle while studying at the University of Kentucky. At the 2000 Sydney Olympic Games, Nancy won the first gold medal awarded when she topped the field in her specialty of air rifle. She also found herself in the rare position of attending the games as one half of a married couple. Her husband, Ken Johnson, was also a member of the 2000 United States Olympic Shooting Team.

Martha Kelley and Barbara Hampson Keller...

Martha and Barbara had some *18 Randles between them but it wasn't* until the 2000 Randle that they teamed up to perform a Randle first. With Martha, suited up and shooting, and Barbara, glued to her scope as coach, they were performing like the well oiled machine that they were. When Barbara noticed a slight rise in the wind *she advised Martha to "favor right"*. *Martha's favor* was a solid ten. However the favor was a little larger than needed and the shot ended up on the adjacent right hand target. The pair entered Randle history as the first to execute a crossfire with grace and good humor.

Other Randle Personalities...

The individual Randle record for team membership belongs to Bobbi Vitito who has been listed on Randle rosters a total of 29 times. In *24 appearances Carolyn Sparks' string of 22* consecutive matches makes her the Cal Ripkin of the Randle Team. Lenore Lemanski first was named to a Randle Team in 1957 and last named in 1999. Her 27 appearances over 42 years earn her the crown for Randle longevity. The highest score fired by a US Randle Team member is 400-38X which was first fired by Margaret Murdock in 1969, in 1973 by Schuyler Helbing, and again in 2001 by Celeste Green. All shooters shot 20X cleans at 50 yards with an additional 18 more Xs at the 100-yard line.

On several occasions sisters have found them teammates. Besides Lemanski and Vitito other sibling appearances have occurred. Barbara and Bonny Hampson shot together in 1969; Schuyler Helbing and Chandler

Chapman fired on the 1975 team, while Eliza Bishop and Lydia Oaks earned Randle T-shirts in 1996. Sue Lausten Avril and Nancy Lausten both became Randle ladies but in different years as did the Caruso sisters, Jamiee and Emily.

Irene and Lois Fisher, Tricia and Jean Foster, and Driver, Lemanski, and Vitito are mother and daughters who have appeared on Randle rosters.

Other Honors...

Randle Ladies have also accumulated a number of other honors. The National Rifle Association initiated the Collegiate All American Program in 1936. Since the first woman was selected, Isabelle Garity in 1954, almost three dozen members of the Randle Team have become All Americans. Almost two dozen United States Distinguished International Shooter Badges have been awarded to Randle Team alumae for their success in international shoulder-to-shoulder competition recognized by the world governing body, the International Shooting Sports Federation.

The Randle Aura...

Marianne Driver, the *Grande Dame* of Randle experience, says that, "Making the Randle Team was, and still is, the desire of every female shooter at Camp Perry." There is a good deal of electricity in the air near the end of the last day of iron sights that is apparent even to a novice. Pre-Randle nerves even strike those who have no clear idea of what is going on. Randle Team Captain Patti Clark recalls the first time she was aware of the team. As a youngster, during her first trip to Perry,

she remembers her name being called but not knowing why, only that it was for *“something important”*. In the excitement of just hearing her name called she dropped handfuls of points and had to wait out that year before she would make the team.

Members of the US Randle Team are held in high regard and the NRA goes the extra mile to honor these women. During the prone phase awards ceremony there is a special segment to recognize the team and introduce the ladies to the assembled shooters. To make selection to the team particularly unique the NRA gives special awards to team members.

Randle Rewards...

Since 1954 members of the team have been presented with a shield shaped brassard that declares them a member of the team. In addition each shooter is given a silver charm bracelet the first time she makes the team and a silver charm with the year on it for each additional year. The bracelet carries the initials of the NRA as well as a small pendent depicting a prone shooter. A more recent tradition, starting in 1982, is the awarding of commemorative T-shirts to team members on the line right after the match. These highly prized shirts are a pleasing pastel color and, from their introduction until 1988 were imprinted with a shield insignia similar to the brassard. They now carry a line drawing of the Randle Trophy with the words, "Randle Cup Team" and the year. The high shooter on the American team is also awarded the Eleanor Dunn Trophy. This annual award was placed into competition by Dunn to recognize the high scorer on the US Team. In 1979 Mary Stidworthy,

at the time a member of the All National Guard Rifle Team, was the first recipient.

The National Rifle Association presents medals to all 14 members of the winning and second place team. The medal shows victory holding an olive branch in her left hand while in her right is a target. In the background is the United States flag while on the right side is a flintlock rifle and powder horn. In keeping with postal match tradition the winners receive silver medals with bronze going to the runners up.

Randle Officials...

The Randle Subcommittee of the NRA Smallbore Committee selects the captain and the coach. Traditionally women named to these positions must have made a significant contribution to shooting. In 1993 the NRA Smallbore Committee added a requirement that in order to be an official the individual must have been a member of the Randle Team at least three times. Each year the Randle Committee submits the names of two women to the President of the NRA for consideration as coach. The woman selected then serves one year as coach after which she is then nominated to be captain. Marianne Driver and her daughter Marianne Vitito, as well as Mary Cook and Patti Clark have the unique distinction of being the only ladies who have served as a captain three times. Ruth Morgan, Winnifred Carr, Lenore Lemanski, Barbara Hampson-Keller, and Irene Fisher have each captained the team twice.

Witnesses are also considered team officials and are usually female shooters from participating nations who

come to Camp Perry to insure that all the rules are followed. In the event that such a witness is not available then a non-participant is chosen to observe. This is the only opportunity for a man to have any official connection with the Randle Team and only a few have been given the honor. The first Randle witness was United States Olympic medallist and World Champion Art Jackson, who performed this duty at the inagural Randle match at Jacksonville, in 1952.

Great Britain's Veronica Tidmarsh has served as official witness to the United States team a record eight times, as well as many times a captain, shooting member, and alternate of the Randle Team of Great Britain. The only position she has not filled is that of coach. She occupies much the same position in the Randle history of Great Britain as does Marianne Driver of the United States.

On the other hand United States Randle Captians Ellen Ross, Irene Fisher, Mary Cook, and Edie Reynolds have served as official witness to the firing of the match in Great Britain. Other witness from the United States represent a distinguished number of male riflemen such as Herb Hollister, Douglas Knoop, Harry Hoy, Dr. Robert Carroll who was head of the Camp Perry scoring detail for many years, George Harris, Ron Wigger, and Lones Wigger.

Team Selection...

The team itself is selected from the top 12 women shooters during the metallic sight aggregate of the National

Smallbore Prone Rifle Championships. The first ten are the firing members while the next two will be designated alternates. In the rare event that a firing member declines to, or is unable to, shoot she then switches with an alternate. All members of the team must be United States citizens.

The official witness is quite often a competitor at the championships from one of the Commonwealth nations.

The Role of The Randle...

Soon after the turn of the century the Randle Match will celebrate it's golden anniversary. Since 1952 the friendly competition between women from English speaking nations has drawn far-flung shooting communities closer together. It has fostered closer relationships between both individuals and national shooting associations. Many young shooters have gotten their first taste of international competition as a Randle Team member. It is a timeless event that many women use to count the passage of time.

The Randle Match reflects *successful shooting's most important* facet: consistency. The rules have remained constant. The targets have remained constant. The course of fire has remained constant. To make the team the shooter must be consistent in performance. Most importantly the goal has remained constant. It is still to do one's best, to place as many bullets as close to the center in a consistent manner as possible, and to represent your country in the world arena.

THE ELEANOR DUNN TROPHY

Eleanor Dunn, a prominent American woman shooter during the 1940s and 50s, was a strong advocate for woman's equality in the shooting sports. During World War II she conducted a recreational shooting program for female Naval personnel stationed at the United States Navy's training facility located at Hunter College in New York City. Her efforts caught the attention of Thurman Randle who was then stationed at Naval Air Station Quonset Point, Rhode Island.

In 1952 Randle, a past president of the National Rifle Association, presented a silver cup as a prize to be awarded each year to the winning team of an international postal

match to held among the women of the English speaking nations that Dunn had organized two years earlier. In 1953 Miss Dunn was honored by being selected to be the captain of the United States Randle Team and in 1979 as the official witness.

During her visit to Camp Perry as official witness she endowed a trophy to recognize Randle Team excellence. Each year since 1979 The Eleanor Dunn Trophy is presented to the high scoring competitor on the United States Randle Team.
